**ORGANIC EXPORT CERTIFICATES** 

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Version 4.7 Previous: 17/08/2022 Effective: 12/03/2024

## PURPOSE

NASAA Certified Organic Pty Ltd (**NCO**) is an accredited/approved certifying organisation for the purpose of providing export certificates for organic and biodynamic produce. Such documentation provides assurance to importing country authorities that the product has been produced in accordance with the requirements of export legislation and/or any importing country conditions.

NCO is accredited/approved to issue export documentation for the following programs:

Australian Government Organic Export Program United States Department Agriculture National Organic Program (**USDA-NOP**) Japanese Agricultural Standard (**JAS**)

Required export documentation varies substantially depending on whether the goods are produced in or outside Australia.

## **Definitions:**

**Organic Goods Certificate (OGC)** – Australian Government Export Document that must accompany any organic or biodynamic shipment of Australian produce.

**Transaction Certificate (TC)** – NCO Export Document that must accompany any organic or biodynamic shipment of international produce.

**NOP Import Certificate USA** – NOP Import Certificate with data that must accompany each shipment of organic agricultural products imported into the United States.

**Certificate of Inspection (COI) UK** – Great Britain Import Document, for any organic product entering the United Kingdom but excluding Northern Ireland.

ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS FOR ISSUING EXPORT DOCUMENTATION				
1.	An OGC, Import Certificate, and/or COI must be issued <i>prior</i> to the consignment/shipment departing the			
	country of export.			
2.	OGC, Import Certificate, TC, and/or COI UK details are to be completed by the exporter in typescript, an			
in accordance with these Guidelines, and emailed to exports@ncocertifiedorganic.com.a				
endorsement.				
3.	OGCs and TCs must be legible after printing and rescanning, or the request will not be approved. If			
	information does not fit on one OGC or TC, multiple documents must be issued for the request. It is billed			
	as one request rather than per the OGC or TC numbers used in the request. Do not make the font si			
	smaller to fit onto one OGC or TC. NCO recommend using a font no smaller than size 10.			
4.	Timeline:			
	a. Completed OGCs, Import Certificates, TCs must be submitted to NCO no later than 12noon the			
	day prior to product departure, in order for documentation to be processed in time to meet			
	export time frames.			
	b. Requests will be processed between the hours of 9am and 4pm (ACST).			
	c. Requests received after 12noon (ACST) will be processed the same day if time allows, otherwise			
	they will be processed the following day - unless phone arrangements have been made with			
	export administrative staff before 2pm of the expected urgent shipment.			



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#### Extra administrative fees apply where NCO receives a request to have export documentation d. endorsed/issued after 3pm on the day of application, if application is received after 12noon (ACST). e. Extra administrative fees apply if export documentation is emailed through incorrectly that requires amending before NCO staff can approve the request. 5. The OGC, Import Certificate or TC and/or COI (UK) must contain: The allocated registered register number (N/A for import certificates), product description, quantity, total net weight & unit specified for each item, • total number of packages, batch/lot numbers, expiry/best before dates, • container numbers/marks, vessel/aircraft details, departure date. Total amount of shipment to be shown in kilograms or litres as applicable. Comprehensive information allowing an accurate trace-back of the product is essential in the event product recall is required. 6. The exporter must place a horizontal ruled line under the final entry of the product listing, followed by a diagonal line through the remaining bottom blank space of this section. 7. The OGC, Import Certificate, or TC must not contain an electronic signature unless agreed by the importing authority. 8. The OGC, Import Certificate, TC, or COI UK will be emailed to the exporter once issued (or a third party, if authorised by exporter to do so). 9. Fees apply for the issue of export documentation. 10. Incomplete OGCs, Import Certificates, TCs, or COIs UK, or those submitted with incorrect supporting documentation will not be approved until any outstanding information has been provided. Additional administrative fees will apply accordingly. If the shipment date or any other details change after the OGC, Import Certificate, or TC has been issued, 11. a new replacement certificate will need to be issued. The replacement OGC (Australia Only) must state "This OGC replaces cancelled NCO OGC #####", and the cancelled OGC must be returned to the NCO office. 12. An OGC cannot be issued after a shipment has departed (Australia Only) unless there is approval from the Department of Agriculture authorising such action. An Import Certificate cannot be issued after a shipment has departed (US NOP only). 13. The original copy of the OGC or COI UK must accompany any shipment from Australia. 14. Where departure details are difficult to obtain due to security procedures, the exporter must complete a 15. "Disclosure Letter" undertaking not to disclose the flight details to other parties. This will allow the freight company to release the information. The letter should be provided on request by the Forwarding Agent. The OGC or TC can then be completed in full. 16. Exports of organic goods from Australia are to be accompanied by a declaration that the goods have either been produced in Australia or have been "substantially transformed" in Australia. 17. OGC, TCs, or COIs must not be amended in any way after it has been endorsed by NCO. An electronic copy of the OGC, TC, or COI UK and supporting documentation must be retained by the 18. exporter for no less than 5 years.



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ADDITIONAL EXPORT CERTIFICATES				
19.	Depending on Importing Country requirements, the exporter may be required to supply additional documentation such as Notice of Intention, Health/Phytosanitary Certificate and/or Request for Permit (RFP), to enable export of the following products: meat, milk, eggs, fish, horticulture, grain products.			
20	This certificate number should be recorded in the "Related Certification" box for OGC's in box 12 for non-

	EU certificates and at Q15 for International certificates. The referenced health certificate number MUST			
	stipulate what type of document it refers to e.g. RFP 6574831 or Phyto 6574831. This box/area must only			
21	be used for listing the health certificate number.			
21.	Any export from Australia to Great Britain requires the exporter to apply for a Certificate of Inspection			
	(COI) Great Britain as well as the Organic Goods Certificate (OGC).			
	Any international operator exporting to Great Britain requires a Certificate of Inspection (COI) Great Britain			
	to be issued. Note: A TC is not required for United Kingdom exports for international operators.			
	NCO must sign the COI before the consignment leaves the country of export or origin as required by Article			
	13(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1235/2008: Control bodies are to carry out the necessary documentary checks			
	before signing box 18. However, Box 14 and 15 of the COI Great Britain are optional. IMPORTANT NOTE: If a request is received by NCO after the shipment has departed the request will not			
	be approved.

Note that conditions relating to documentation for exports may change without notice, therefore				
	exporters/operators are responsible for ensuring exported product complies with importing <sup>1</sup> country regulatory			
requirements and/or product labelling laws well in advance of exporting certified organic product.				

<sup>1</sup>Where the use of a treatment is allowed under the National Standard but prohibited under an importing country requirement, an OGC may not be signed. For example, a treatment for QLD fruit fly is allowable in Australia but contains an ingredient which is NOT allowed under US NOP.



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#### **ATTACHMENT A EXPORT DOCUMENTATION COUNTRY REQUIREMENTS GOODS PRODUCED IN AUSTRALIA** Under the Export Control (Organic Goods) Rules 2021, the Australian Government requires all exported 1. organic or biodynamic product from Australia to be certified by an approved organic certifier. Export of certified organic product is prohibited unless a compliant OGC has been issued for the product. 2. An OGC is required for all<sup>2</sup> exports out of Australia if the words "organic"," biodynamic", or similar appear on the accompanying paperwork, irrespective of whether the importing country requires an 'organic export certificate' or not. <sup>2</sup>Except where the total quantity of a consignment/shipment is below 10kgs or 10 litres. 3. Certified organic product must: a. either be "Product of Australia" (a product which has been produced with ingredients all of Australian origin) or be "Made in Australia" (a product made from local and/or imported ingredients that has been significantly transformed in the production process in Australia); b. not be labelled as "Domestic Only" or "Not for Export"; c. be certified by an approved certifier under all the provisions of the National Standard for Organic and Bio-dynamic Produce; d. not have been produced under a certifier's private standard unless this is recognised by the importing country authority; and e. comply with importing country requirements. 4. Procedures for Airfreighted and other urgent shipments For airfreighted shipments, the paperwork required for OGCs or TCs must be emailed to exports@ncocertifiedorganic.com.au for approval and flagged as "URGENT", along with a phone call to notify export administration staff of this. Export certificate for non-certified operator (third party trader) (Australia only) 5. NCO will issue an OGC for a non-certified exporter only when the certified product is packed in a retail pack by a processor/packer certified to the National Standard. 6. NCO advises that any OGC request received after a product has left Australia cannot be approved by NCO. **GOODS PRODUCED OUTSIDE AUSTRALIA** TCs and COIs apply to internationally certified organic product. 1. These certificates also apply to Australian exporters where product includes ingredients imported from overseas which have not been substantially transformed in Australia. SPECIFIC DESTINATION COUNTRY REQUIREMENTS **USA Certificate Requirements** Both Australian and International Exporters certified to the USDA NOP are to request an Import Certificate to be issued by NCO through the Organic Integrity Database. United Kingdom Certificate Requirements: (note exports to Northern Ireland are completed using EC TRACES system) Both Australian and International Exporters – "Certificate of Inspection – Great Britain" – Supplied by NCO to Exporters at the Exporters Request. An Import Certificate request must be submitted via NCO's submission form, which includes all 1. instructions, and submitted to exports@ncocertifiedorganic.com.au for approval. It must be received and approved prior to the departure date. Exports of USDA NOP labelled products must be certified to the USDA NOP Standard by an accredited 2. certifying agent.

1.	Exports of all JAS labelled products must be JAS certified except honey, alcohol, health & beauty/cosmetics
	which are not included in the JAS Law for Organic Products. These products may therefore be exported to
	Japan as certified organic under the NASAA Certified Organic label or as conventional product.
2.	Livestock products and livestock feed may be exported as certified organic.
3.	All JAS certificates must include both the JAS number and NCO registration number.

	"Certified in accordance with the terms of the US-Canada Organic Equivalency Arrangement".

	organic seal to be used on products entering Canada. The product must be certified to the USDA NOP and		
	comply with the NOP and Canadian labelling requirements.
